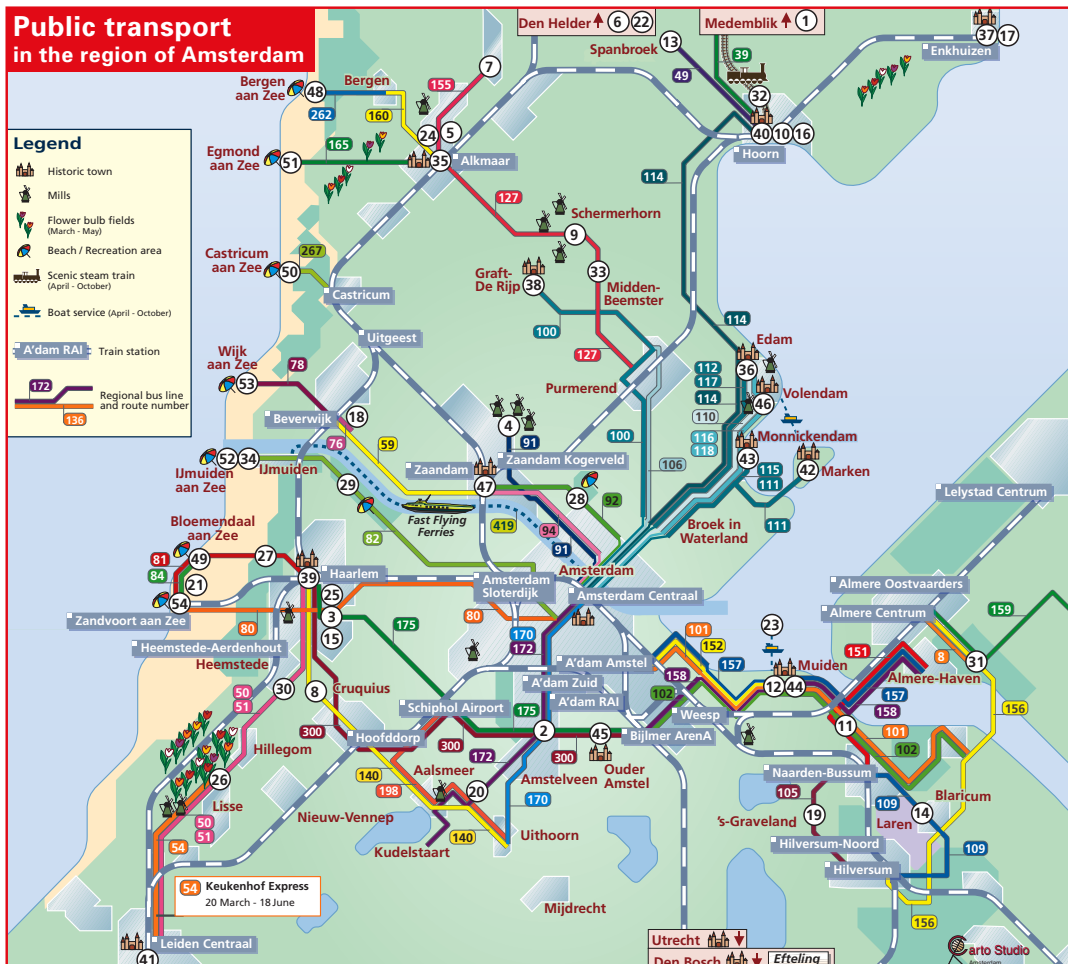

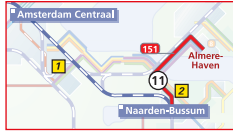

Public Transport Information

Transit Passes for the Bus, Tram and Metro

The 'strippenkaart' and zone system

The 'strippenkaart' ticket is the most frequently used transit pass for the tram, bus and metro. To determine how many 'strippen' you require, calculate how many zones you will travel and add one more 'strip'. The zones are indicated on a map located at every bus and tram stop. When in doubt, ask the conductor or driver for help. Important: your ticket is valid only when stamped. The ticket is stamped by the conductor or driver. On the tram and at metro stations you can stamp the 'strippenkaart' in the orange or yellow automated stamping machine.

Day-pass or '8-strippenkaart'

The day-pass or '8-strippenkaart', grants you one day of unlimited travel in the Netherlands with the bus, tram and metro. This day-pass is available from city and regional transport drivers and various points of sale in Amsterdam.

Arriva tickets

The Arriva bus company offers a number of user-friendly bus passes for those travelling north of Amsterdam. A day-pass is €6, and a family day-pass, valid for five people (maximum two adults) is €10. These passes enable visits to sights such as the cheese market in Edam, the Beemster world heritage site or the dykes of Volendam. A stamped pass is valid for the entire day, unlimited, on all Arriva busses in the Waterland region. Passes can be purchased in Amsterdam at the GVB Tickets & Info, the information offices of Amsterdam Tourism & Convention Board and from Arriva bus chauffeurs.

The region of Zaanstreek-Waterland is rich with traditional Dutch places of interest. Discover the museums, handicrafts and culinary treats the region has to offer, or actively explore by way of walking routes, cycling or boat tours. Arriva offers a selection of seven daytrips and two arrangements, an overview of which can be found in the Waterland daytrip brochure. The brochure is free with purchase of a Waterland ticket or family day-pass at one of the various points of sale. For more information please visit www.arriva.nl

Connexion tickets

The Connexion bus company travels from Amsterdam to Zaanse Schans in just 30 minutes. The fare is just €2.50. Every half hour bus #91 departs from Central Station. Zaanse Schans is one of the top tourist destinations of the Netherlands. This charming hamlet is kept in its original condition and is home to various museums, mills, workshops, restaurants and a visitor's centre. You can also explore the area by boat tour. Visit Holland like it was three centuries ago!

The family day-pass offers unlimited travel anywhere Connexion goes for a maximum of two adults and three children under eleven for just €10. All Connexion tickets can be purchased from the bus driver. For more information visit www.connexion.nl/waterland

Train Tickets

Where can you buy a train ticket?

The Netherlands Railway (NS) provides an NS ticket vending machine at every station. Purchasing a ticket at one of these automated machines is fast and easy. Payment can be made with change or by bank card. Mid-sized stations have an AH to Go, Kiosk, or Wizzl store where tickets can be purchased. The larger stations provide ticket service counters. Train tickets can also be bought at the information offices of Amsterdam Tourism & Convention Board located at Amsterdam Schiphol Airport, the Leidseplein and Central Station.

One way or return?

A return ticket is valid only for travel within the same day. If you will return on another day, purchase two one-way tickets. A 'weekend return' is available on the weekends; valid for travel after 19:00 on Friday, with return on Saturday or Sunday.

Seasonal offers

NS offers a variety of season tickets which reduce the cost of transit within selected periods. More information is available on-screen at the NS ticket vending machines, at the service counters or on-line at www.ns.nl

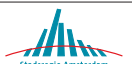
